## **Background**

The Energy Transition Platform (ETP) is a multi-country platform that brings together energy practitioners and select CSOs working on energy for the countries of South Asia- Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka. The overall objective of ETP is to fast-track energy transition in the respective countries through a collaborative work of all partners.

Since its inception in 2018, ETP has been tracking energy transitions in the above-mentioned countries through a comprehensive repository of information on energy scenarios across the countries. South Asia region is home to almost a quarter of the world's population and countries in this region are on the path of rapid development and economic growth. With the need to keep global temperature from rising above 1.5°C, a rapid energy transition is required here.

This webinar serves as an official launch of the Energy Transition Platform. The webinar also aims to understand the energy transition scenario in the South Asian region from sectoral experts on the associated barriers & enablers, and how countries of this region can collaborate effectively to scale-up energy transition while achieving global climate goals. Partner organisations of the ETP will also shed light on the current energy scenario and the challenges & opportunities associated with energy transitions in their respective countries.
