## Presentation of a Study

The Chernihiv region (oblast) was largely occupied by Russian troops in the first weeks of the full-scale invasion and is one of the ten regions of Ukraine most affected by the destruction of the war. The Russian occupation, which lasted around 40 days in February-March 2022 and covered almost two thirds of the region, has left deep scars. The proximity to Russia and Belarus, as well as constant shelling of the border areas, further complicates the situation.

Despite all the challenges, local civil society is making plans for recovery together with the local self-government and is seeking support and new partnerships. We will be speaking with three representatives from the Chernihiv region about local needs and expectations of Germany.
