The relationship between feminists and advocates of cultural diversity has always been complex. The invocation of cultural diversity has often served as a pretext for ignoring and undermining claims of gender equality as they are enshrined in international human rights treaties. The UN Convention for the Elimination

of all Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) therefore obliges States Parties to take steps towards reforming those cultural patterns which have supported traditional gender roles.

The Berlin Conference, jointly organized by the Heinrich Böll Foundation and the German Institute for Human Rights, aims at a systematic analysis of both tensions and possible affinities between women's rights and cultural diversity.

The conference will take place in honour of Hanna Beate Schöpp-Schilling member of the CEDAW committee for 20 years, who left the committee at the end of 2008.
